December 8, 2016 Facility Study Committee (FSC) Minutes

The FSC was called to order at 6:35 by Scott Sabol in the Parkview Learning Center cafeteria. The committee was joined by school board members John Westphal, and Barb Hagedorn; administrators Bob Clark, Becky LeBouton, John Schlender, Lee Zarnott, Joel Wondra and HS instructor Dave Seiler. Also present were representative from Bray Architects and J.H. Findorff & Sons and members of the general public.

Matt Wolfert presented a revised preliminary plan with solutions for areas of concern at each of the 3 school buildings along with estimated costs. Many of the ideas that were presented at the previous meeting were incorporated into the plan. The presentation was based on a conceptual scope and was consistent with similar projects in other districts. Projected costs were inclusive of capital maintenance cost for the current plan. Matt made it clear that the preliminary range of costs are not final, are not detailed, and are not inclusive of operational costs. Matt also reminded the group that the bus garage and facilities equipment were in need of repair and upgrades. The total to address every need is around \$49m. It was agreed that the community could not and would not support that kind of cost and that there would have to be modification to plans while long term solutions were determined

Joe Hohmann asked for the floor and gave his opinion of a possible solution which would close Parkview Learning Center to save the district expense in the future. This would combine the primary students with the middle school students.

The committee was asked to give their opinion of the process and proposed solutions and prioritize what they feel should be prioritized and how much of what has been discovered and presented to the group that they would support. Each person present was sent an electronic version of a Long Range Facility Planning survey to complete. The results were then shown to the group and discussed. The committee processed the poll results (understanding that not all members were present) and discussed what should be addressed now vs. put into a more long term plan of up to 20 years. There will be further discussion of possible solutions and phases at the next meeting. A recommendation is due to the school board on January 9.

Meeting adjourned at 8:50pm. The next meeting will be at the middle school on December 20 at 6:30pm.
